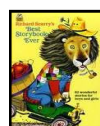
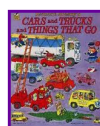
## SUMMER AUTHORS!

### June: Richard McClure Scarry



1919-1994

Richard Scarry was born in Boston, Massachusetts in 1919 and his family ran a small shop in Boston. He attended business college, studied at the School of the Museum for Fine Arts and was drafted into the US Army during WWII. Mr. Scarry worked for art departments of various magazines and worked for Little Golden Books. Mr. Scarry's most famous series of books was about Busytown. Over 100 million copies of his books have been sold and translated into 30 languages! He spent a lot of time in Switzerland writing and illustrating books. Here are some of his books:

Marty lives in New Boston, NH with his wife, Kerri and two children, Alex and Victoria. He received an Elementary Education degree from the University of Florida. As a children's author and illustrator, he brings years of teaching experience to his high energy, fun-filled presentations. He was the 2005 illustrator for the NH Summer Reading Program. Marty recently left the action-packed world of teaching second grade to pursue his writing and art full time. Some of his best selling books are *Fall Is Not Easy*, *Winter Woes* and *The Rules*.
